TO ALL THE PEOPLE OF THE ANGLICAN CHURCH IN NORTH AMERICA:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I travel the Anglican world on your behalf, one of the most striking things I experience is the extent to which believers in other places feel connected to our whole North American Church. A meeting of the Anglican Relief and Development Fund Global Trustees, a gift carried for the new Bishop of Singapore, presence in the Primates Council of the nine GAFCON Provinces, sermons preached for the Provinces of Rwanda (October) and Uganda (December) – all these are ways that I symbolically connect you to your Anglican brothers and sisters – millions of them – around the globe. In some sense, my coming to them is received as if our whole Church had come to them. It is a joyful, and somewhat mysterious, function of the apostolic office.

There are some one hundred thousand Anglicans in North America, but our Provincial Office has contact information for only 8000 of them. I would like to be able to connect with you, too, and not just symbolically. Twice a year the Province produces an extraordinary magazine entitled *The Apostle*. I would love for it to go to all of our households. We also produce a monthly e-newsletter. I know you would be excited by the stories of how the Lord is changing lives and blessing our missionary advance. Would you kindly provide your contact information on the attached form?
